

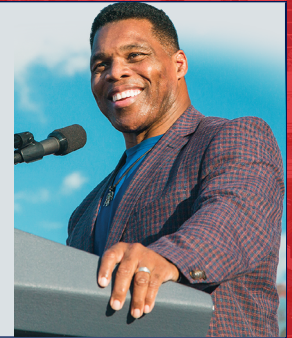


An Important Message from the Southeastern Carpenters Regional Council

Hershel Walker



Helped secure \$8 million to support the Port of Savannah and create 700 jobs

Secured a \$2 million federal grant for road and infrastructure improvements to create a new Inland port in Hall County, bringing 700 jobs and \$185 million in private investment to Georgia's economy

Laws Warnock helped pass in 8 months include:

- Infrastructure and Jobs Act, which sends \$2.7 billion to Georgia, creating UNION JOBS for carpenters
- CHIPS Act, which returns UNION MANUFACTURING JOBS from overseas
- Inflation Reduction Act, which invests in clean energy and UNION JOBS; Already, a huge project in Dalton, Georgia, is planned with a solar-panel manufacturer



Believes in Prevailing Wages and equitable employment practices in the workplace; Fully supports vocational training, trade schools, and apprenticeship programs



Supports new, stronger laws to fight worker misclassification and construction tax fraud

Believes government should not have spent money on the Infrastructure and Jobs Act

Refuses to say he would have voted for the Infrastructure and Jobs Act because he said he doesn't know about it
